## QUALIFICATION DESCRIPTION

This course is a great introduction to the Construction/ Carpentry trades.

This course is designed for students who intend to pursue a career in the construction industry and associated trades or would like to build an interest in this area. Our aim to provide you with the foundation knowledge and the elementary skills required to work in the building and associated trades.

This qualification prepares you with the essential skills needed to enter a full apprenticeship in your chosen field of construction, including carpentry, joinery and shopfitting or wall and floor tiling.

- how to safely operate a range of tools and equipment including but not limited to Industrial static woodworking machines, power tools and hand tools.
- how to plan and prepare for a project to determine component requirements and correct work task sequence.
- complete a range of projects including constructing full size timber load bearing walls, timber sub-floor frames. Erecting roof trusses, external panelling. Hanging doors and fitting lock-sets.
- trade math, which deals with the practical application of using calculation for Area, Volume, Scale and Linear measurements.

Djarragun College has an agreement with the authority to issue general construction induction training cards, on behalf of Workplace Health and Safety Queensland.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Enrolled Djarragun College students may apply to enrol in a VET course from Year 10 onwards.

## DURATION AND LOCATION

This Certificate II course is delivered over 2 years on site at Djarragun College, in our purpose built trades training centre and workshops.

## DELIVERY MODES

The course will be delivered in the classroom, face-to-face, using a range of practical and theoretical teaching and assessment methods.

## FEES

There is no additional fee for enrolling in a VET course, there are two different College fee levels applicable for enrolling at the College. Any VET courses are covered within this fee.

## SUPPORT SERVICES AVAILABLE

The College has invested heavily in support services to support student learning. We have a substantial support staff made up of Teaching Assistants, Learning Enhancement teachers and Youth Support Officers.

We also partner with Ngak Min Health to access services that are typically not available in schools.

**RTO OBLIGATION**

Djarragun College guarantees that the student will be provided with every opportunity to complete the qualification. We do not guarantee employment upon completion of this qualification.

Students who are deemed competent in all units of competency will be awarded a Qualification, a Record of Results and full QCE points.

Students who achieve at least one unit of competency (but not the full qualification) will receive a Statement of Attainment and may receive some QCE points.
