

Primary Keeps Kicking Goals: NFL Flag Championships

Our Year 5/6 team had an incredible adventure competing in the National Championships on the Gold Coast. After winning the Cairns competition, we were one of only 10 teams to qualify. This was a huge achievement considering we'd trained for less than a term! While we didn't take home the trophy, the trip was filled with exciting firsts for many of our students: flying on a plane, a train ride to the Gold Coast, staying in a fancy hotel, and visiting SeaWorld, where students even rode rollercoasters. A massive thank you to the NFL for making this unforgettable experience possible.

Premier's Reading Cup Challenge

We received our certificates for the Challenge at the beginning of this term. No one could remember if Djarragun had participated before, so this was big. Really big. Some students even went past the number of books required to meet the challenge. Now that we've done our first year, we will be back next year to do it again.

Rock and Water

The Year 5/6 class participated in Rock and Water sessions this term; a program that incorporates various activities and games designed to build self-confidence and promote self-awareness. The course is particularly engaging for students who thrive in active, game-based environments. Students are taught to stand firm, use "rock" (assertive) or "water" (calm) communication styles, walk away from conflict, explore non-aggressive solutions, and gain a deeper understanding of themselves, their instincts, and their personal goals. The students have even started applying these techniques in the playground.

Year 6-7 Transition Days

Our Year 6 students embraced their upcoming move to Secondary School with a series of transition activities. Highlights included a Drama lesson with Ms Tanya, which they loved so much they didn't want to leave, E-Games with Mr Andres (described as "EPIC!"), and Maths with Dr Michael, where they collected data by eating bugs—possibly chocolate, possibly real! They also practiced navigating secondary routines, including morning tea and lunch in the Dining Hall, although they're still adjusting to less playtime!

It has been a big year for the Academy of Creative and Performing Arts regarding events, competitions, exhibitions and student completions. Six of our Year 11 and Year 12 students completed a Certificate III in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Cultural Arts in 2024. Three of our Year 12 students graduated from the College with this qualification. As our graduating Year 12 students embark on this new chapter in their lives, our wish for them is to continue to enjoy the journey and stay curious and never stop learning and seeking knowledge. Also, remember that education is not confined to the walls of a classroom, but it is a continuous journey throughout life which is full of opportunities waiting for them to seize. We look forward to seeing these artists continue to grow their arts practices, explore and share their talents and keep the cultural arts alive. All three became members of the UMI stable of artists, as this will provide a pathway into the visual art world.

Djarragun College was very well represented in the Queensland Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Foundation Creative Art Awards (QATSIF) held in Brisbane. The awards were sponsored by Griffith University, this is an annual competition for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Secondary students for the State of Queensland.

This year, fifteen of our art students entered artworks in the 2024 QATSIF and Griffith University Creative Arts Competition. All fifteen students received some sort of recognition for their entries within the competition.

Holly Douglas received an outstanding 2nd place in the State for her acrylic painting and a third place in the State for her lino print. Solace Barnaby, Kaylene Sambo and Kaissia Dick received 3rd place in the State for their paintings in their year and age levels. Iona Ambrym, Peter-Lee Anderson, Tonita Ellis, Shantelle Evans, Chloe McGilvary, Savannah Ngallametta, Olivia Pootchemunka, Gwen Thomas, Tarek Turner and Eileen Williams all receive a highly commended for their art works entered the competition in their respective age and grade levels.

The students who study a Certificate III in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Cultural Arts are not only from our local Indigenous communities but from around Cairns, Kuranda and Yarrabah and from the remote regional Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities of Cape York and the beautiful Torres Strait Islands. We also have students who come from the small, isolated communities of the Northern Territory. All of whom choose Djarragun College as a preferred place to study.

This year the students were very busy creating artworks for the exhibitions and events which were held this year. The Cultural Art students' artworks have been represented in five different exhibitions throughout the year. "The Summer Show", "You and Me" and "Culture Through Our Eyes" were exhibitions curated by the staff at UMI Arts. These exhibitions were held at the UMI Manoora gallery complex.

"Tribalmania" was an exhibition which was one of Djarragun's major events on the calendar. This year "Tribalmania" represented twenty-four First Nations Artists who are currently studying Art in Years 10, 11, and 12. The exhibition is held annually in September in conjunction with our NAIDOC Week celebrations. The event not only showcases the talents of our Cultural Art students, but the outstanding skills of our hospitality students who cater for this event and who are studying a Certificate III in Hospitality.

The event was well attended and our students were thrilled to sell many of their paintings on the day.





This year we decided to take "Tribalmania" to the city and hold an exhibition and event at "Birrgal", Djarragun College's training restaurant for our hospitality students. Birrgal is located on Sheridan Street in Cairns.

"Tribalmania in the City" was an exhibition which represented the works of nine Cultural Art students. This invitation only event not only showcased the art students but also highlighted the culinary skills of our Certificate III Hospitality students who, once again, presented a delicious three course meal. The guests had a chance to experience the culture of Djarragun College's training restaurant.


